The Lord's Prayer

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy
name.

Thy kingdom come,

Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread;

And forgive us our debts,

As we forgive our debtors;

And lead us not into temptation,

But deliver us from evil.

For thine is the kingdom and the power and the
glory, forever. Amen.

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy
name.

Draw a father and child:

God loves you like a perfect father and wants you to depend on him like a child!

Draw the heavens:

God isn't far away. He's right there with you, wherever you go!

What is God like? Draw or write!

“Hallowed” means we recognize God is awesome and want the world to know that too.

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. (part 2)

Draw something you can't do:

Why are we asking God to make his name glorified? Because we can't glorify God enough on our own!

Draw idols people worship and cross them out:

"Hallowed be thy name" means we want God to be worshipped, not other things.

Draw something awesome that you like talking about:

"Hallowed be thy name" means we want everyone to talk about how great God is!

Thy kingdom come

Draw a king:

A kingdom is a place ruled by a king.

Draw an explorer planting a flag on a beach:

We're asking God to claim the whole world as his kingdom!

What is God's kingdom like? Draw or write:

Check out Romans 14:17 if you want a short description! "Thy kingdom come" means we want God to make the whole world look like that.

Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

Draw some things you want:

Your “will” is what you want or desire. God’s will is what God wants or desires.

Draw or write some things that God wants:

Look at Micah 6:8 if you want some ideas!

Remember: sometimes God doesn’t answer a prayer the way you want because God wants something different than what you’re asking for!

Give us this day our daily bread

Draw your favorite three meals:

God wants you to trust him to provide you with what you need each day!

Draw something relaxing to you:

If we trust God to take care of us, we won't be as stressed out!

Draw something you need that isn't food:

This is the part of the Lord's Prayer where you should pray for the things you need (and for other people!).

And forgive us our debts

Have you ever owed something? Draw the story!

A debt is something you owe.

Draw two elephants and a mouse.

In the Parable of the Unforgiving Slave (Matthew 18:23-35), if the Unforgiving Slave owed two elephants the other slave would have owed him a mouse.

What do we owe God? Draw or write!

Can we ever “pay it back”?

As we forgive our debtors

Have you ever been mad at someone? Draw it:

Your “debtors” are people who have done something mean to you.

Draw two elephants and a mouse (again):

In the Parable of the Unforgiving Slave (Matthew 18:23-35), if the Unforgiving Slave owed two elephants the other slave would have owed him a mouse. You owe God two elephants, and your debtors owe you a mouse!

Draw a picture of yourself forgiving someone:

God has forgiven us for so much, so we should forgive other people.

And lead us not into temptation

Have you ever wanted to do something bad?

Draw it:

You are tempted when you feel the desire to do something you know is wrong.

Draw something that might happen that you're scared of:

The word for "temptation" can also mean "trial." So, "lead us not into temptation" can also mean "don't let bad things happen to me!"

Draw a shepherd leading sheep. (Also draw your favorite superhero.)

God wants to lead you to safe places! God also wants to protect you- just like a superhero protects people!

But deliver us from evil.

What's something wrong in the world? Draw it!

Sometimes bad things happen in the world around us. God wants us to ask him for protection from those things!

Draw a lion:

“Evil” could also be translated as “the evil one” (the devil). 1 Peter 5:8 compares the devil to a lion on the hunt.

Draw a lion tamer taming a lion:

Good news! God is much, much stronger than Satan. We don't have to be afraid of the devil when we have God on our side!

For thine is the kingdom and the power and
the glory, forever. Amen.

Take your best shot at drawing how awesome
God is:

This last part of the prayer is a reminder that God is great, greater even than
our words can describe!
